Based upon our OY 24-25 Action Plan (see page 10 of this NL), we still have quite a few areas that need to be work on. As the IRS requirement for MOWW, as a 501(c)(19), is to have 75% of our members be Veterans, we will only be allowed to recruit new members who are prior or current military veterans. Presently our Chapter has 293 total Companions with 155 Living. Please use the information on page 9 of this NL to help in your recruiting efforts and note the change in membership dues. **Remember that our Chapter is currently offering to sponsor a one-year free membership for any E7, E8, or E9 who would like to join us. Our Chapter also needs to continue to work on our Community and Outreach programs. If you would like to help us to reestablish a Gold award program affiliation with the Girl Scouts Cactus-Pine Council, please let me know. We continue to actively seek a mentor-partner relationship with the Phoenix Division of the U.S. Naval Sea Cadets Corps (USNSCC) and would appreciate assistance with this effort, as well.**

As always, I look forward to with all of you in service to our communities. Please keep in mind our motto of "It is nobler to serve, than to be served. Hopefully you will find some part of our MOWW programs that excite you and compel you to volunteer. We are still looking for folks to fill our Chapter Leadership positions, become Committee Chairpersons, and help with our Patriotic Educations Program. 

The AZ Veterans StandDown Alliance (AVSA) is a program of the AZ Housing Coalition that holds annual events and resource fairs in 13 of Arizona's 15 counties, including, in the past, the nation's largest event of its kind, the annual Maricopa County StandDown.



These events allow veterans and their families who are experiencing housing instability and homelessness to get and stay connected to supportive services. The AZ Youth Leadership Inc (AZYL Inc) has an exciting announcement and new fundraising opportunity that has been made available through a partnership with the Wreaths Across America (WAA) program and the MOWW.

As a 501(c)3 nonprofit Sponsorship Group, AZYL Inc has joined the WAA in their mission to Support, Honor and Teach through the sponsoring and placing of wreaths on veterans' headstones on National Wreaths Across America Day. This

year that event falls on Saturday, 14 December 2024. This collaboration with WAA involves our group spreading the word about WAA and helping to raise funds for wreath sponsorships at our local Arizona participating WAA cemeteries. A portion of the funds that we raise – that is \$5 out of every \$17 wreath sponsored – will be returned to us, so that we can defray the costs of our annual AZ Youth Leadership Conferences.

How can you help? Well, our AZYL Inc has been assigned the following ID: AZ0289P and webpage https://www.wreathsacrossamerica.org/AZ0289P. Please ask your family and friends to sponsor a wreath or volunteer to help lay wreaths. Here's how you can do that. First, click on the webpage LINK above. Click on the button to Sponsor Wreaths. Choose the number of wreaths you would like to sponsor. Remember, our AZYL program will receive \$5 back for every wreath sponsored. You will be guided through the payment process and receive an invoice and receipt through your email. It's as easy as that.

If you want your sponsored wreath to be placed at a specific local AZ cemetery or at a specific gravesite, you can do that while you are inputting your order. Be aware that the default cemetery for all AZYL Inc orders is AZNMCP, or the National Memorial Cemetery of Arizona. But, as mentioned, you can make a quick search by going to the top navigation bar and clicking on the Search icon (a magnifying glass), clocking on the Search Locations button and typing in "Arizona". Every AZ cemetery that has a registered WAA program is listed there. The cemetery will also show if they will accept grave specific wreath placement requests and/or have a full ceremony there.

Note that you can make a Sponsor order from either our Group page OR the Location page. Bottom line, before you complete your order, please make sure that it has the correct cemetery code AND the credit goes to our AZ0289P AZYL Inc Group.

If you are interested in volunteering to place a wreath at a participating WAA cemetery or help with their ultimate removal and clean-up, please do so online and make sure you credit your MOWW Chapter or our AZYL Inc group.

We truly appreciate your assistance in this new worthy fundraising collaborative venture. I encourage you to go online as soon as possible to get your orders placed for this year's event.

CHAPLAINS CORNER: Questioning God's Power; Readings 2 Kings 18:17–37

"The LORD will surely deliver us." 2 Kings 18:30

When you encounter challenges do you wonder where God is or why He hasn't delivered you immediately? Have you ever doubted God's power to resolve a difficult situation? You are not alone.

When Hezekiah was threatened by an Assyrian invasion, he decided to try to solve his problem without turning to the Lord. It didn't work. The Assyrian king, Sennacherib, sent his armies and officials to besiege Jerusalem. They arrived with a message for the king, "On whom are you depending, that you rebel against me?" (v. 20).



The Assyrian king suspected that Hezekiah had made an alliance with Egypt for military defense and that Judea might be trusting their God to save them. To this he had a simple response, "Has the god of any nation ever delivered his land from the hand of the king of Assyria?" (v. 33). "How then can the LORD deliver Jerusalem from my hand?" (v. 35).

His logic was simple. He looked at the circumstances of all the other nations his people had conquered. Those nations prayed to their gods to no avail. He thought: We have surrounded you and destroyed your cities. What makes you think your god is any different? What the Assyrian king did not know is that the God of Israel uses difficulty in the lives of His people. In each case, He has the good of His people in mind. The threat that Jerusalem and Judah were enduring said absolutely nothing about the Lord's power.

Deep down Hezekiah knew that to be true. Therefore, he ordered his men not to answer the Assyrians while he went to the Temple (19:1). His faith understood how the world really worked. The next time you're in difficult waters, guard your heart against the crippling thought that God isn't in control. Turn to Him and wait.

Go Deeper. Have you experienced something that caused you to question what God was doing? How does Hezekiah's story help answer those doubts?

Prayer: King Hezekiah's confidence that God is in control is a good reminder of our dependence on Him. Lord, our prayer today is that in our own times of difficulty and uncertainty we will turn to You and have patience to wait for You.

+_MEDIC's BAG_+ DECEMBER IS HIV/AIDS AWARENESS & FLU VACCINATION MONTH

Each month, the Office of Disease Prevention and Health Promotion (ODPHP) - under the Office of the Assistant Secretary of Health (OASH), U.S. Department of Health and Human Services - features select National Health Observances (NHOs) that align with their priorities for improving health across the nation. In December, ODPHP is raising awareness about HIV/AIDS and about the importance of getting a flu vaccine. The following information and resources are provided in this article, as we join the NHO conversation and help to advocate for better health!

World AIDS Day. Every year on December 1, we observe World AIDS Day to raise awareness, renew our commitment to ending HIV stigma, and advance efforts to expand access to HIV testing. Explore HIV.gov for important resources to help inform and engage your community. Healthy People 2030 offers a range of resources to help prevent sexually transmitted infections, including evidence-based resources for professionals. Additionally, Healthy People 2030 highlights the importance of expanding HIV awareness through its objective to increase the number of people who know their HIV status. To promote awareness, share MyHealthfinder's HIV testing guide and questions to ask your doctor about HIV testing to help others feel prepared to discuss testing with their health care providers. Finally, consider wearing a red ribbon to show solidarity with people living with HIV — and discover more ways to make a difference, like sharing the 2024 World AIDS Day campaign materials on your social media and spreading the word within your networks.

National Influenza Vaccination Week (December 2–6). National Influenza Vaccination Week takes place December 2–6, offering a chance to focus on the benefits of getting a flu shot. Join in by sharing the Centers of Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) materials to educate your family, friends, and other people in your community about flu prevention. Visit the ODPHP MyHealthfinder for tips on staying safe this flu season, and check out Healthy People 2030's Evidence-based Resources and the new Leading Health Indicators infograph-



ic visualizing the proportion of people who get a flu vaccine every year.

HOLIDAY SAFETY & CRIME PREVENTION TIPS. A Security.org survey noted that 49M Americans (nearly 19%) have had at least one package stolen in the past 12 months. 36% of U.S. adults surveyed say they've sent a package somewhere other than their home address, 54% say they've changed plans in order to receive a package in person, & nearly 7 in 10 said they weren't willing to change up their online holiday shopping habits in the face of package theft.

In light of these statistics, the National Neighborhood Watch organization https://www.nnw.org/ suggests taking the following actions this Holiday Season: (1) Practice home safety - use locks on doors & windows; don't hide spare keys outside; light outside dark areas; lock vehicles; use caution when strangers are at your door; have neighbors check your home if you are away; set security cameras & timers for lights (2) Avoid porch theft - network with neighbors; have packages delivered to your work; use security cameras & smart locks; report thefts & know what was to be delivered; get insurance on packages and (3) Grinch proof your Holiday lights.

The Military Order of the World Wars - The Phoenix Pacesetter Chapter

Pershing's request that his officers continue serving America after their active military service ended following World War I. Since MOWW's establishment in 1919, MOWW members ("Companions") have lived by the Military Order's motto: "It is nobler to serve than to be served".




